




Dual-administrative spectrum used to locate the decentralisation degree and tendencies of Ibero-American federal systems






xecutive-legislative balance of




xecutive-legislative balance of Mexico

Conclusions

PROTOADMINISTRATIVE

Brazil

- Seeking to eradicate regional inequality.
- Boost legislative centralization and indirect administration.
- The establishment of superintendency and oversight was ratified.
- Implementation options have been negotiated through Intergovernmental organizations.

HYBRIDS

- Argentina national funding of Welfare policy stands-out, provincial strong distrust derives in non-legislated discretionality which forbids oversight.
- Spain is undergoing a dual stage with moderate concurrencies.
- México holds revolutionary social ideals, excesive concurrencies hidden under a dual facade, adapted bilateralism.

Subnational government haven't been able to consistently influence national policy design in any of the studied federations.
