What Will Life be Like in 2035?

What will our world be like in 2035? It would be tempting to mention the clichés – food pills, flying cars, and bases on the moon – but the reality will probably be less exciting. The world in 2035 will probably be much like it is today, but smarter and more automatic.

The Future of Food

Genetically modified (GM) crops and synthetic meat will be responses to the growing need for greater food efficiency as populations continue to grow. But also a lot of people will realise that we need to have a better diet, one that is more plant-based and less dependent on processed foods.



The Future of Love

We are becoming more independent and less influenced by the old social norms. This will have an impact on the relationships

we form, with fewer people choosing traditional marriage, a rise in official (and unofficial) civil partnerships, and more people remaining single for longer, if not forever.



The Future of Work

In the future, there will be new jobs created: the computer engineer/mechanic who fixes the self-driving Uber taxis; genome mappers and bioengineers; space tour guides; and vertical farmers. Technology will continue to disrupt businesses and eliminate jobs, creating new professions.



The Future of Health

Prevention will probably become the focus as we gain greater control of our health information, using self-monitoring biosensors and smart watches to continuously collect fitness

data. Also, web apps will process this data to keep electronic records. Using these numbers, companies will be able to build a model of your overall health that can predict future problems.
